Curriculum/College Credit Programs

Curriculum/College Credit programs are indicated in green.

Curriculum classes are for college and university credits. Certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees are awarded to those successfully completing the required classes appropriate for each credential.

Students must be at least 16-years-old to take Curriculum/College Credit classes.

Financial assistance is offered for most programs and many scholarships are awarded each year. High school students who successfully complete four or more classes when in high school are eligible to have tuition paid for two years immediately following graduation through The Sandhills Promise.

Two Years of Tuition and Fees Paid in Full for HSE Graduates

For students who earn a High School Equivalency (GED) diploma at SCC, are committed to earning a college degree or a Workforce Continuing Education credential, and have proven themselves in the classroom, they can apply for the HSE Scholars Program. This program will provide two full years of tuition and fees to earn a college degree or a WCE credential. The two years of eligibility begin the semester after the final HSE test and will end six consecutive semesters later. SCC HSE graduates not qualifying for the program are eligible to receive a \$250 scholarship to use at Sandhills within one year.

Escort Vehicle Operator

This course meets the training requirements set by the NC Department of Transportation to certify oversize-overweight load escort vehicle drivers. Course components consist of defensive driving, escort driver requirements, skills training, and an exam. Students must have a valid driver's license without restrictions other than use of corrective lens, must not have a DWI or reckless driving within the previous 12 months, and must be 21-years of age (can be 18 with a Class A commercial driver's license). All initial applicants must complete a 2- or 4-hour defensive driving course that has been approved by the National Safety Council. This can be done after taking this class.

NCGS 10B-5(b) provides the following requirements to be commissioned as a Notary Public in NC: 1) Be at least 18 years of age or legally emancipated as defined in Article 35 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes; 2) Reside or have a regular place of work or business in this State; 3) Reside legally in the United States; 4) Speak, read, and write the English language; 5) Possess a high school diploma or equivalent; 6) Pass the course of instruction described in this Article, unless the person is a licensed member of the North Carolina State Bar; 7) Purchase and keep as a reference the most recent manual approved by the Secretary that describes the duties and authority of notaries public; 8) Submit an application containing no significant misstatement or omission of fact. 

The Sandhills Promise is a guarantee that if a student successfully completes at least four SCC courses while in high school they can attend SCC at no charge for the two years after graduation.
