

What is a General Education assessment?

Our assessment is a multi-year process where the college identifies fundamental competencies which our students need to succeed. From these competency categories, we created student learning outcomes or SWiBAT statements, which identify the specific skills or abilities we want our students to demonstrate through learning at our institution.

Annually, samples of student work (also known as artifacts) are collected for each area and scored using a SWiBAT rubric. These scores help us collect data to determine our students' performance in each competency. The General Education Assessment committee, comprised of faculty members, uses this data to discuss, evaluate methods, initiate changes/modifications, and ultimately, to enhance student success.

What are our SWiBAT Statements?

Competency	SWiBAT Statement
Communication I	Students will be able to demonstrate effective language skills.
Communication II	Students will create and present original work using discipline-specific material.
Critical Thinking	Students will be able to demonstrate analytical reasoning abilities by drawing inferences.
Reading Comprehension	Students will be able to read and demonstrate comprehension of written material.

What specifically do we want our students to learn?

SWiBAT statements are broad. To drill down further into identifiable skills, we rely on the SWiBAT rubrics. Each statement has its own, corresponding rubric that defines the SWiBAT using three to four "Principles of Assessment." For example, Communication II is broken down into:

- Organization
- Language Use
- Supporting Material
- Central Message

How will I know the results of the assessment?

Results from our Scoring Day are distributed annually in several ways:

- Published as part of our Campus Wide Outcomes (CWO 2.6)
- Assessment results and summary of findings are published on the P&R Moodle page. One page summaries are prepared annually, with additional information supplied in the General Education Assessment Report
- Results are also presented during Faculty Assembly meetings each Fall
