a persistent journey

MADELINE SMITH

Madeline Smith's path to graduation hasn't followed a straight line. Mom of two, a small business owner, military spouse, Ms. Health and Fitness HERS Cover Competition participant, and Architectural Technologies student, Madeline has had a lot of starts and stops in her life. She initially started college in 2004 at the University of Massachusetts's at Amherst and later enrolled at SCC in 2019. Flash ahead to Fall 2025 and after accomplishing months of sobriety, she enrolled again at SCC to aim her sights on reaching her goals of becoming confident in AutoCAD, Revit and contributing to the thoughtful design of her local community.

"SCC has been a place where I've been able to rebuild confidence, challenge myself, and prove to myself that growth is always possible. Having access to education in a supportive, local environment has made continuing my recovery and pursuing my goals feel achievable instead of overwhelming." Her advice to others, "You don't have to have everything figured out to move forward. Progress comes from showing up consistently, being willing to ask for help, and giving yourself permission to change speeds, change direction, and to try again."

A native of New York, Helenka obtained her undergraduate degree at Barnard College and master's from Tufts University in Public Health. Her early travels took her to Moore County while working with Food Corps and turned out to be where she met her husband who served in the military. After stints in Texas and Maryland, where she worked with state agencies and child nutrition programs in the school systems, they chose to come back to the region to raise their two-year-old daughter. During that time, she worked for federal government.

"The EMT program at Sandhills worked out well since it was at night and my husband could take over childcare duties and weekend duties as needed," Helenka said. "It was condensed, and we learned a lot of information from very qualified instructors who were passionate about their field. Hearing their real-life stories and examples made the material come to life in the book and I enjoyed learning medical terminology." She finished the program and passed the state exam to earn a North Carolina Emergency Medical Technician credential and may volunteer as an EMT.

For students who earn a High School Equivalency (HSE) diploma at SCC, are committed to earning a college degree or a Workforce Continuing Education credential, and have proven themselves in the classroom, they can apply for the HSE Scholars Program. This program will provide two full years of tuition and fees paid to earn a college degree or a WCE credential. The two years of eligibility begin the semester after the final HSE test and will end six consecutive semesters later. SCC HSE graduates not qualifying for the program are eligible to receive a \$250 scholarship to use at Sandhills within one year.

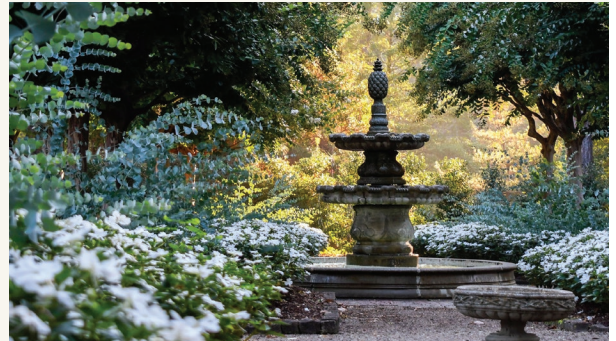
