Curriculum/College Credit Programs

Curriculum/College Credit programs are indicated in green.

Curriculum classes are for college and university credits. Certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees are awarded to those successfully completing the required classes appropriate for each credential.

Students must be at least 16-years-old to take Curriculum/College Credit classes.

Financial assistance is offered for all programs and many scholarships are awarded each year. High school students who successfully complete four or more classes when in high school are eligible to have all tuition paid for two years immediately following graduation through The Sandhills Promise.

Two Years of Tuition and Fees Paid in Full for HSE Graduates

For students who earn a High School Equivalency diploma at SCC, are committed to earning a college degree or a Workforce Continuing Education credential, and have proven themselves in the classroom, they can apply for the HSE Scholars Program. This program will provide two full years of tuition and fees to earn a college degree or a WCE credential. The two years of eligibility begin the semester after the final HSE test and will end six consecutive semesters later. SCC HSE graduates not qualifying for the program are eligible to receive a \$250 scholarship to use at Sandhills within one year.

Students must have a valid driver's license without restrictions other than use of corrective lens, must not have a DWI or reckless driving within the previous 12 months, and must be 21-years of age (can be 18 with a Class A commercial driver's license). All initial applicants must complete a 2- or 4-hour defensive driving course that has been approved by the National Safety Council.

Notary Public

This course is required for anyone interested in becoming a Notary Public for the first time. It is recommended for all notaries as a refresher course. Note: The current edition of The Notary Public Manual for North Carolina, March 2016, ISBN: 978-1-56011-851-0, is required for admittance to the class and can be purchased at the SCC bookstore or on Amazon. It is strongly recommended that you study the guidebook prior to class attendance to be better prepared for the state examination given at the end of the class. NCGS 10B-5(b) provides the following requirements to be commissioned as a Notary Public in NC: 1) Be at least 18 years of age or legally emancipated as defined in Article 35 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes; 2) Reside or have a regular place of work or business in this State; 3) Reside legally in the United States; 4) Speak, read, and write the English language; 5) Possess a high school diploma or equivalent; 6) Pass the course of instruction described in this Article, unless the person is a licensed member of the North Carolina State Bar; 7) Purchase and keep as a reference the most recent manual approved by the Secretary that describes the duties and authority of notaries public; 8) Submit an application containing no significant misstatement or omission of fact.

Students must provide current state or federal picture identification for admission to class. An active duty military and civilian ID cards DO NOT meet identification requirement.

Insurance Pre-Licensing

SCC offers a variety of insurance pre-licensing courses that include Life, Health, Medicare Supplement/Long term care, Property, Casualty, Personal Lines, and Adjuster. Students interested in taking insurance pre-licensing courses can choose from two online delivery options: Synchronous or Asynchronous classes. SCC's insurance pre-licensing classes are done in partnership with Insurance Educational Systems, an approved educational provider with the Department of Insurance.

For questions about insurance pre-licensing courses and step-by-step instructions on registering for these courses, contact Lori Degre at degrel@sandhills.edu.

Asynchronous classes can begin at any specified time of the month that is agreed upon between the student and the Sr. Director of Career Training, Students will have 60 days to complete their asynchronous course. Students will be contacted via email and/or phone call to discuss their start date of class. These classes are self-paced and include 40 hour classes - \$350 video streaming activities. The study requirements will be met with video, quizzes and study recommendations on the 20 hour classes - \$210 video. The cost of these classes is lower due to the video nature of the class, but this option allows you to watch videos 10 hour classes - \$175 multiple times to review the material. Instructors are available on-call to address student questions. Cost includes material fee. Material fee is nonrefundable once registered. Synchronous classes have specific start and end dates and times. The study requirements will be met with a live 40 hour classes - \$405 instructor five days a week based on the specific class schedule. 


