Zane is a proud graduate of Sandhills Community College and the co-founder, President, and CEO of Spiritus Systems. He recently served as commencement speaker at the May 17, 2025 ceremonies at SCC. He started Spiritus Systems while deployed in Afghanistan—drafting product designs and building the company’s first website from a tent between missions. After returning home, he helped grow Spiritus from a single sewing machine in a North Carolina garage to a five-acre, 50,000-square-foot manufacturing campus in Aberdeen that supports a workforce of nearly 120 employees. Under his leadership, Spiritus Systems has become an internationally respected name in tactical equipment, known for its innovation, modularity, and commitment to American manufacturing.

Zane also serves on the Board of Advisors for the Military Division of the Advanced Textiles Association, where he works to support and sustain the U.S. textile industry. His business partner and company has teamed with Sandhills Community College Workforce Development and Corporate Partnerships for leadership training with his staff through NC Edge.

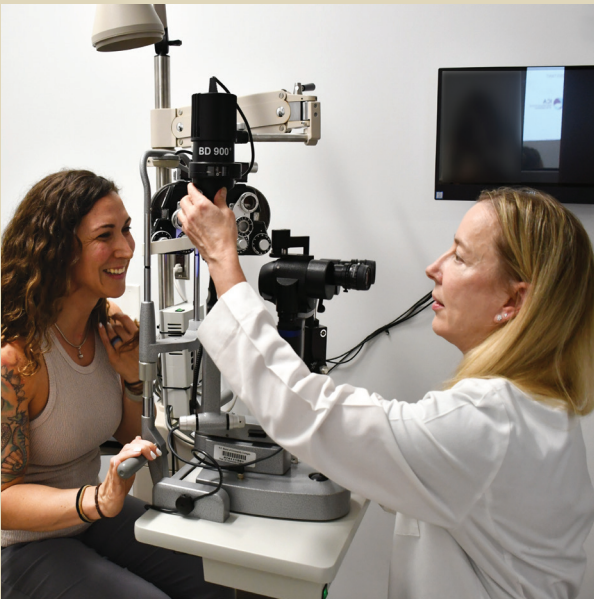
NEW PROGRAM: OPHTHALMIC ASSISTANT
