Examples of licensure or registry application requirements (among others) may include submission of an official high school or college transcript, a Social Security number, a photo ID, driver's license, or passport. Some states require criminal background checks and fingerprinting. Final determination of individual state requirements for registry or licensure can only be confirmed by that state's governing body.
