PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE NOTES

Most states require that a student graduate from a state-board approved educational program, pass an examination, and obtain a license to work as a massage therapist. State designations include Licensed MAssage Therapist (LMT), Certified Massage Therapist (CMT), Licensed Bodywork & Massage Therapist (LBMT). Four states do not regulate the profession. Vermont requires a registry, but does not require passing an exam or obtaining a license.

There are several licensing exams used in the United States, the MBLEX, NCBTMB, and CESI. Some states require that a particular body accredit the Massage program. Examples of licensure or registry application requirements (among others) may include submission of an official high school or college transcript, a Social Security number, a photo ID, driver's license, or passport. Some states require criminal background checks and fingerprinting. Final determination of individual state requirements for licensure or registry can only be confirmed by that state's governing body.

North Carolina: Applicants for licensure must graduate from a board-approved school and submit scores from the MBLEX. Students with a criminal conviction may not be eligible for a state license, which is required for employment. Each situation is evaluated on an individual basis by the NC Board of Massage and Bodywork Therapy (919-546-0050 or admin@bmbt.org). Approved programs must include 500 hours* of supervised instruction, including 200 hours in fundamental theory and practice, 100 hours in anatomy & physiology, 15 hours in professional ethics, 15 hours in business management pretices, 20 hours in psychological concepts, 150 hours in other related courses.

Sandhills Community College Therapeutic Massage program is approved by the North Carolina Board of Massage and Bodywork. Graduates of Sandhills' diploma program who successfully pass the MBLEX in the State of North Carolina are eligible to apply for a license as an LBMT.
